SUPPLY LIST

The list below includes suggested supplies for making the crafts presented at the OCN Holy Week craft group. You can substitute any of the items with similar materials of your choice. You will also need white and, optionally, colored printer paper (green, yellow, orange, red, blue, brown), and crafting staples such as scissors, glue, and tape.

Palm Sunday:

- A sheet of green card stock or sturdy printer paper (plain printer paper is too flimsy for this project), dimensions about 8.5" x 11"; additional pieces of thinner paper, white or in different shades of green
- · One jumbo craft stick or one drinking straw
- · Colorful ribbon pieces (optional)

Holy Monday:

- Pieces of tissue paper, about 4" x 4" each, in colors yellow, orange, and/or red; colored paper napkin can be used instead
- · Materials of choice for decoration

Holy Tuesday:

- A selection of herbs and spices (such as cinnamon stick pieces, whole cloves, cardamom pods, dried or fresh orange peel, allspice, vanillin flavoring powder, Earl Grey tea leaves)
- A wooden spoon
- Two small containers and a strainer
- Lukewarm water
- One or more bottles or jars to store your "perfume" in
- · Food coloring or glitter (optional)

Holy Wednesday:

- Thirteen popsicle sticks
- · Colored markers or pencils and a thin black marker or pen
- Colored paper (blue, red, brown) is optional if you don't want to use plain printer paper

Holy Thursday:


- · About eight sheets of colored tissue paper, preferably in shades of purple, and one green
- A piece of cardboard about 9.5" x 12" (a piece cut out of a cardboard box works fine)
- Double-sided tape is optional but very useful for this project


Holy Friday:

- A plastic cup (a wide-mouthed tumbler works best)
- · One pipe cleaner, preferably purple
- A piece of ribbon, preferably purple, about 24" long
- Decorations of your choice such as sequins, glitter, stickers etc.
- An LED votive candle is optional to light the lantern. Crumpled pieces of red-yellow-orange tissue paper can be used instead, to pretend there is a fire lighting in the lantern.


Holy Saturday:


· One piece of string, about 24" long



















