## MIDDLE FLAP: RIGHT HALF

The right half of the middle flap includes three pieces for the Sunday of St. Mary of Egypt:








- A fan book to work on the life of the Saint.
- A nine-part tab book to explore different places where an Orthodox hermit might choose to live.
- An octagon accordion book to reflect on the sayings of the Ancient Fathers of the Desert.

### Fan book

On each piece, the child writes (or draws a picture of) a characteristic of St. Mary of Egypt or a fact from her life.

**Examples:** St. Mary of Egypt... lived in the 6th century / was a hermit / lived alone in the desert / is a model of repentance... etc.



Print this page on sturdier paper for best results. Cut the ovals all around on the solid lines. You can use as many ovals as you wish. Stack the ovals together with the cover on top. Punch a hole on the mark. Fasten with a mini paper fastener. Glue the fan book onto the lapbook.

# MIDDLE FLAP: RIGHT HALF

## Tab book

This activity helps discuss the possible dwellings of a holy hermit. The child writes an example of a Saint who lived in each kind of place and, if desired, a few basic facts about him/her. Alternatively, they can draw pictures.



Cut the shapes all around and stack them together, paying attention to the position of the tabs. There should be nine tabs: three on top, three on the right, and three on the bottom. Place the cover on top. Staple the pages together on the left side. Glue the book onto the lapbook. If nine tabs are too many, you can choose to use only six (right side and bottom) or only three (right side).





## MIDDLE FLAP: RIGHT HALF

### Octagon accordion book

He who has learned to be silent has found peace in all things.



This activity helps reflect on sayings of the Desert Fathers. After discussing the saying, the child can write a short example from their own life. Alternatively, they can make a drawing. If you find the sayings too many, you can cut and use as many octagons as you wish.

Glue here

Cut the shapes out all around on the solid lines. Glue the cover part to the top of the larger shape. Fold up like an accordion on the dotted lines. Glue the back of the last piece of the accordion onto the lapbook.
