#### The symbol of this Mystery is...

The Bread and the Wine

#### A PHRASE FROM A HYMN:

We have seen the true light; we have received the heavenly Spirit; we have found the true faith, worshipping the undivided Trinity, for the Trinity has saved us.

#### The Mystery in the Gospels:

Matthew 26:26-29 Luke 22:14-20 John 6:53-59 Holy Communion or the Holy Eucharist is the most important Mystery of the Church. In the Eucharist, the bread and the wine offered by the faithful truly become the **Precious Body and Blood** of our Lord Jesus Christ. When partaking of the Holy Eucharist, we, together with the whole creation, are lifted up in prayer and thanksgiving, becoming one with our Lord and Savior.

The service where the Eucharist is offered is called the **Divine Liturgy**. During the Liturgy, we participate with our whole body, mind, and soul, in the life of our Lord - from His birth to His Death and Resurrection.

To receive Holy Communion, we must **prepare ourselves**. We usually fast on the previous day, and read the prayers of preparation. We must not eat or drink anything in the morning before we receive. It is important to partake of the Eucharist with a clear conscience and a light heart: if we did something wrong to someone, we must ask them to forgive us; it is also good to participate in the Mystery of Holy Confession.





## Hold COMMUNION

#### THREE ICONS FOR THE HOLY EUCHARIST



#### **The Mystical Supper**

This is the icon of the first Holy Eucharist, offered by our Lord Himself. It shows Christ with the twelve disciples sitting at the table in the upper room of a house, having their last meal together before the Lord's Passion. On the table, we can see food, drink, and eating utensils. There is a piece of bread in front of each disciple.

#### **Christ communing the Apostles**

This icon is symbolic of the Holy Eucharist: it does not show an event in the way it actually happened. We can see the Altar Table, and on it a paten containing pieces of Bread and a chalice containing the Wine. Christ is behind the table, handing the Bread to the Apostles with one hand and the Wine with the other.

#### The Lamb of God

This is also a symbolic icon. Christ is pictured as a baby, laying upon the paten or chalice. This icon clearly shows that the Eucharist is the real Body and Blood of Christ.





#### PREPARING FOR HOLY COMMUNION





We fast on the previous day, and don't eat or drink anything in the morning.	
We pray to our Lord Jesus Christ.	
We ask for forgiveness and go to Holy Confession.	

#### **HOLY COMMUNION - BOARD GAME**



The following two pages can be used to easily make a board game. Print out the following page to make the game board. Laminate or print on card stock for sturdiness. To make the spinner, follow the instructions on the page after next. Alternatively, a die can be used.

To play the game, you will need:

- The game board
- The spinner or one die
- Board game pawns or any small colored objects than can be used as placeholders (buttons, large beads etc.)

#### How to play

The point of the game is to go over important facts about Holy Communion in a fun and interactive way. All placeholders are placed on **START**. The first player spins the spinner or throws the die and moves his/her placeholder a corresponding number of squares. The spinner directs the player to either move forward or backward in the game. If a die is used, then the player only moves forward.

The player reads aloud the information on the square that s/he landed on. Then s/he has to close his/her eyes and repeat the information in his/her own words.

If using the spinner, there are two choices of actions, depending on the results of the spinner.

- The placeholder had moved FORWARD
  - If the player remembers the facts correctly, the placeholder stays where it landed. If not, it returns to its previous position.
  - \* This is also what happens if a die is being used instead of the spinner.
- The placeholder had moved BACKWARD
  - If the player remembers the facts correctly, the placeholder goes back to its original position. If not, it stays where it landed.

After the action is performed, the next player takes a turn. The first player to reach **FINISH** wins. If there is no time to cover the whole board, the player who moved closer to FINISH wins.

We get ready for the Eucharist by asking for forgiveness and going to Holy Confession.

## **SPINNER**


Print out this page. For sturdiness, print on plain paper and laminate, or use premium printer paper or card stock. Cut out the circle below.

To make the spinner, you will need:

- The circle cut-out
- A brad (metal paper fastener)
- A paper clip
- A piece of packing tape

Punch a small hole in the center of the paper circle. Insert the brad through the hole. Fold the back of the brad mid-way, not at the top, so that the brad is poking up from the paper circle about half an inch. Tape the brad on the back of the circle. Slide the paper clip on the brad. Ready to spin!
